

ORDER OF TEMPORARY CLOSURE

1. Under the authority of 25 U.S.C. §2701 *et seq.* and 25 C.F.R. §573.6(a) and (b), the Chairman of the National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC) hereby gives notice that the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma is ordered to cease and desist the operation of all "Reels of Skill" video gaming machines located in its gaming facilities within 24 hours of the NIGC affirming Notice of Violation 98-01 by issuing a notice and order to the Respondent, pursuant to §577.15 of NIGC regulations. This action is necessary due to violations of 25 C.F.R. §573.6(a)(11) of NIGC regulations as described in that Notice of Violation.

2. The Chairman of the Commission may rescind this Order for good cause shown.

3. Under 25 C.F.R. §573.6(c), within seven (7) days after service of this Order, the Respondent may request, orally or in writing, informal expedited review by the Chairman. The Chairman must complete such review within two (2) days after receipt of a timely request. Within two (2) days after the expedited review provided by 25 C.F.R. §573.6(c), the Chairman must decide whether to continue the Order and must provide the Respondent with an explanation of the basis for the decision.

4. Whether or not a Respondent seeks the informal expedited review described in paragraph 3 above, within 30 (thirty) days after service of this Order, the Respondent may appeal to the full Commission under 25 C.F.R. Part 577 by submitting a notice of appeal to the National Indian Gaming Commission, 1441 L Street, NW, suite 9100, Washington, DC 20005. The Respondent has

a right to assistance of counsel in such an appeal. A notice of appeal must reference this Order.

5. Within ten (10) days after filing a notice of appeal, the Respondent must file with the Commission a supplemental statement that states with particularity the relief desired and the grounds therefore and that includes, when available, supporting evidence in the form of affidavits. If the Respondent wishes to present oral testimony or witnesses at the hearing, the Respondent must include a request to do so with the supplemental statement. The request to present oral testimony or witnesses must specify the names of proposed witnesses and the general nature of their expected testimony, whether a closed hearing is requested and why. The Respondent may waive its right to an oral hearing and instead elect to have the matter determined by the Commission solely on the basis of written submissions.
