Notice of Consultation on Regulatory Review and Consultation Policy

Dear Tribal Leader:

On behalf of the National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC or Commission), we invite you to participate in a consultation meeting on two notices of proposed rule and our Draft Consultation Policy. Specifically, we seek input on amendments to the following regulations:

- (a) *Part 543* – Minimum Internal Control Standards for Class II Gaming; and
- (b) *Part 547*– Minimum Technical Standards for Gaming Equipment Used with the play of Class II Games.

Through these two notices of proposed rule, the Commission seeks to remedy inconsistencies between Parts 543 and 547 and to add additional surveillance measures to the kiosks section of Part 543. Additionally, we would like to discuss changes to the NIGC's Draft Consultation Policy, which we have updated for clarity and to streamline the consultation process.

The NIGC recognizes and respects the sovereignty of Indian tribes and the government-to-government relationship that exists between the United States and tribal governments. Accordingly, the NIGC is committed to implementing the President's November 5, 2009 Executive Memorandum on Tribal Consultation with Indian tribes and Executive Order 13175 prior to and during any rulemaking process.

As such, we invite all tribal leaders to share their views with the Commission these regulations and the Draft Consultation Policy at a consultation scheduled for March 15, 2013 in Catoosa, Oklahoma, from 9 to 11 a.m.; at the following location:
