Milton Cartwright Jr. joined the National Indian Gaming Commission July 2021 with over twenty years of IT leadership and management experience. He serves as the Information Technology Manager for the Division of Technology. As the IT manager, Cartwright Jr. manages and oversees day-to-day IT operations of common systems infrastructure services, to include cloud-computing, email, network, communications while leading technology-driven projects for the agency.

Before joining NIGC, Cartwright Jr. served as the IT Director at the Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division. His role consisted of coaching, mentoring, and providing technical guidance to the IT Business Office Team. He also analyzed, and formulated budgets as well as provided expertise to advance strategic roadmap development and implementation. His experience includes expertise in Office of Management Budget mandated requirements, cloud migration projects, and Federal Information Security Management Act (FISMA) certification and accreditation (C&A) activities.

Cartwright Jr. earned the DOJ Meritorious Award for Superior Performance of Duties, as well as the Special Achievement Award for Sustained Superior Performance of Duty.

Cartwright Jr. is a graduate of Athens State University, Athens, Alabama where he received a Bachelor of Science in Management of Technology.
