



KEY POINTS Typical TGRA Structures:

Working Commission - Commissioners have offices on-site and participate with the dayto-day regulation of the facility. Non-term limited they are permanent employees of the TGRA.

Board Style - Delegates the day-to-day regulatory oversite to regulatory employees on site. Meets periodically and often has term limits.







KEY POINTS

- Independence Clearly defined and established by Ordinance or Tribal law regulations
- Separate arm of the Tribal Government
- Organized exclusively for regulation and monitoring of the gaming operations on behalf of the tribe



KEY POINTS:


- Overarching goal of TGRA/Commission Gaming Regulation: ensure that all gaming within a Tribe's jurisdiction operates in accordance with Tribal Laws and Regulations.
- In order to maintain objectivity and independence the TGRA should be both politically and personally separated from tribal politics and operations.
- Best Practice to have an Ethics Policy.





KEY POINTS:

- The TGRA has authority in regulating gaming
- Cabazon reaffirmed the Tribe's authority to regulate gaming
- The passing of IGRA provided some specific requirements and submissions
- The bulk of the responsibilities are left to the Tribe



KEY POINTS:

TGRA's do not manage the facility, their job is to make sure that the facility operates within Tribal, Federal laws and if applicable within the regulations set forth in the State Compact.
