PRIVACY & RECORDS MANAGEMENT OFFICER TIM OSUMI

Tim Osumi serves as the Privacy & Records Management Officer for the National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC). In this position, Osumi oversees all privacy, records management matters, and is the agency's designated Senior Agency Official for Privacy (SAOP). His responsibilities include monitoring and reporting on, agency compliance with the Privacy Act, Federal Records Act, Freedom of Information Act, and Paperwork Reduction Act and he is responsible for formulating agency policy and guidance on matters related to these statutes.

Prior to assuming this position in the Division of Technology, Osumi worked in the agency's Office of the General Counsel where he developed and maintained the General Counsel's case and document management application as well as assisted in the development of the agency's Freedom of Information Act business processes.

On numerous occasions, Osumi has been recognized for his achievements including in 2019 when he was the recipient of the NIGC Chairman's Award for his successful transitioning of the agency's records from analog to electronic schedules and systems.

Osumi received a Bachelor's degree from Georgetown University and has numerous certifications pertaining to information governance and regulatory compliance.

The Indian Gaming Regulatory Act created the [National Indian Gaming Commission](#) to support tribal self-sufficiency and the integrity of Indian gaming. NIGC oversees the efficient regulation of 524 gaming establishments operated by 248 tribes across 29 states.
