

SUPERVISORY ACCOUNTANT WEI ZHONG

Wei Zhong is the Supervisory Accountant for the National Indian Gaming Commission, an independent federal regulatory agency established within the Department of the Interior. Zhong supervises the day-to-day activities of the accounting group, which oversees and manages the general accounting functions, including accounts receivable, accounts payable, payroll and general ledger, as well as preparation of internal/external audits and fianancial projections/reports.

Zhong joined NIGC as an Accountant since December 2009 and served as the Supervisory Accountant since March 2015. Prior to working for the NIGC, Zhong held various accounting positions and served as Director of Finance at the National Association of College and University Business Officers where she oversaw all accounting functions. Zhong also served as Director of Finance at Global Rights, leading multinational finance teams from over seven countries.

Zhong is a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and holds a Bachelor's of Textile Engineering and a Master's in Business Administration with a concentration in Accounting.

The Indian Gaming Regulatory Act created the <u>National Indian Gaming Commission</u> to support tribal self-sufficiency and the integrity of Indian gaming. NIGC oversees the efficient regulation of 524 gaming establishments operated by 248 tribes across 29 states.
