Dear Tribal Gaming Regulator,

The National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC) would like to thank you for providing feedback on the proposed changes to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) related to Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Criminal History Record Information (CHRI). The draft MOU has been revised, where possible, to incorporate comments received from Tribes and their representatives during a 30-day comment period following my <u>November 13, 2020 Letter</u>. This most recent version better expresses both the NIGC and Tribes' obligations under federal law, regulations, and policies. Although the majority of these requirements are not new, both the FBI and the NIGC agree that explicitly stating them in the MOU will assist in achieving compliance. A clean version of the revised draft MOU is attached along with a summary of the comments received.

As part of our continued outreach, we request your review and input on the revised draft so that the MOU may be implemented in a manner that causes minimal disruption and/or expense to Tribes. In providing input, please consider that NIGC is unable to modify federal law or regulations related to FBI CHRI<sup>1</sup> or CJIS Security Policy obligations. Please submit your comments and suggestions no later than **March 22**, **2021**, to NIGC.Outreach@NIGC.gov.
